CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Chairman Drigin called the Board of Trustees meeting to order and on behalf of the Board of Trustees, President Clark and his cabinet members attended a SGA meeting and awarded awards to the students who were recognized for their achievements. A few projects they are working on include an appeal for traffic and parking concerns, helping Bears Who Care (for party), Student Activities Board, and the new ideas for the new building. On item 6, the Board of Trustees discussed the idea of the ground floor of Tillighast Hall. He and Interim Vice President Zimki talked to the SGA about their ideas and their interest in helping the students. With the recent resignation of a fellow Board member, Ah Vale, the Board provided a letter of appreciation to Ah.

Maria Hegblom, MSCA Chapter President, addressed the Board on behalf of the MSCA members. A few activities that have attended the Board committee meetings are appreciated. She is here on behalf of the Executive Committee representing 31 members who are elected by the faculty. Over the past semester, there have been lots of issues for our students, retention, mental health. These issues are felt within the classrooms and challenges in growing the faculty. Our mission is to provide a safe environment. As we move forward, it will be helpful to highlight the classroom experience and significant problems. Career Services

President Clark and a representative from the Career Services Center. Vice President Mife commented that the space will have a terrific impact for John Paganelli, director of Career Services, provided a presentation on Career Services as a professional organization. The May 2019 survey first generated in his office is important to them in taking the place. He thanked President Clark, Vice President Mife and the Trustees for approving, providing and investing in the office space. They are experiencing more traffic and have received terrific positive feedback. Career Services works each and every day on career development services. The faculty at BSU all do a terrific job of the classroom to educate students and faculty about taking place. There were 20 classes in the fall; 115 students hoping to get their degrees by faculty and RA's. They reach out more and find former employees. They have administrative support in the camps. An Etiquette Director is held for the first time in the history of individual appointments and drop-in hours are held. They contact about 6,600 students throughout the year. Approximately 15-20 human resource managers come to the campus each year. They reach out to faculty hires and let them know a good highlight of their services. Career panels, practice interviews, and job and internship fair and an education career fair are organized. They are changing their platform and moving to more physical and digital model called "Had Shake."

Trustee Alexander acknowledged the work of his office in very important for the future. The staff make it possible for students to climb the ladder and we are proud of them all.
